

- Today we are going to learn all about the laws that are applicable to our marine resources.




The legal framework



Why are the laws so important to marine resources?

- To regulate the utilization of our marine resources
- To protect and conserve our marine resources
- To ensure sustainable marine resources for future generations







What is a legislation?

The word legislation refers to the laws that are applied. For marine resources the Marine Living Resources Act 18 of 1998 important.



This act says:

- to provide for the conservation of the marine ecosystem, the long-term sustainable utilization of marine living resources and the orderly access to exploitation, utilization and protection of certain marine living resources; and
- or these purposes to provide for the exercise of control over marine living resources in a fair and equitable manner to the benefit of all the citizens of South Africa.





What regulations do I have to know about?

These laws are:

- Marine Protected Area legislation- This refers to laws that apply to an area that are managed by a conservation entity such a CapeNature or a government department such as The Department of Forestry, Fisheries and the Environment
- 2) Protected Species legislation-This refers to legislation that protect the marine plants and animals within a protected area.



What can you do to protect our marine resources

- Promote the ethos of catch what you need, and release your excess catch
- Avoid off-road vehicle use in ALL coastal zones as it has a negative impact on marine species
- Manage all your waste effectively
- Join in coastal clean-ups and report any transgressions to the appropriate local authorities.
