



ROCHERPAN NATURE RESERVE





Rocherpan exists because of a happy accident. In 1839, a local farmer closed off the mouth of Papkuils River in an attempt to find improved summer grazing for his livestock. By forcing the river to flow behind the dunes that separate the sandveld from the sea, he inadvertently created a perfect habitat for water birds. The rhythms of nature took over. At Rocherpan, visitors adjust to those rhythms. Time moves differently here, as guests while away hours watching water birds wade peacefully in the pan, or simply staring out at the beautiful blue Atlantic Ocean. Rocherpan boasts an impressive variety of endemic and endangered bird species and has become a sanctuary for many of the birds who have made it their home. The reserve is synonymous with birding, but its nearby unspoilt beaches and thoughtfully constructed eco-cabins beckon those who simply want to explore the best that the West Coast has to offer. In spring, a brilliant carpet of wildflowers transforms the reserve, competing with the birdlife to put on the most spectacular display.




Rocherpan lies 25 km north of Velddrif on the coastal road.Velddrif can be reached on the West Coast Road (R27) that starts in Cape Town and goes through Milnerton before running along the coast through Bloubergstrand, Melkbosstrand and Langebaan. From Melkbosstrand, continue straight on the R27 until you reach Velddrif. Once in Velddrif, turn left at stop. Continue straight to next stop then turn right (SAPS on the right). Continue for 9km to the town of Dwarskerbos. Continue straight for 14km and Rocherpan will be on your leic.

CHECKLIST: WHAT TO BRING

To gain access to the beach and the bird hides, visitors need to leave the accommodation area and drive to the next gate, where clearly marked signboards will guide you.

FIREWOOD


Please check with the reserve regarding availability of firewood before you arrive.



ROCHERPAN RULES

PLEASE REMEMBER







Keep the surrounds and facilities clean.



Fires may only be made in designated fireplaces.



Make sure that all fires are extinguished before you leave or go to sleep.



Look out for the small tortoises on the reserve, particularly when driving.



Keep the mesh shutters closed at all times to prevent animals from entering the units.



Stay on existing tracks – careless driving through the veld destroys plants and small creatures.



Prevent soil erosion by avoiding walking off the trails.







Keep all noise to a minimum after 22h00.
