#### At Keurbooms River Nature Reserve,

visitors might find themselves thinking of Rat's sage words to Mole in The Wind and The Willows: "There is nothing absolutely nothing — half so much worth doing as simply messing about in boats." Just 8km away from the busy seaside town of Plettenberg Bay, Keurbooms gives visitors the chance to experience the drifting, hypnotic rhythms of life on the river, to spend days messing about in boats, gliding through silky water while gazing up at the forest above, listening to the chorus of birds.

Named after the Western keurboom tree, the reserve is a sanctuary for indigenous trees, including the Cape beech, giant stinkwoods and the beautiful Outeniqua yellowwoods. A lush destination filled with an abundance of plant life, the reserve can be explored on walks, boat trips and canoe trails.



#### FROM CAPE TOWN (N2):

The Keurbooms River Nature Reserve lies 8 km beyond Plettenberg Bay. On the N2 towards Nature's Valley and Port Elizabeth, turn left at the "Ferries" signboard. Proceed to the entrance gate of Keurbooms River Nature Reserve.

#### FROM PORT ELIZABETH (N2):

On the N2, 8km before Plettenberg Bay, turn right at the "Ferries" signboard. Proceed to the entrance gate of Keurbooms River Nature Reserve.

## WHISKEY CREEK CABIN

A 400m walk from canoe mooring point.

An open plan cabin with four double bunks and two single beds, with mattress and pillows only (no bedding or towels supplied). The outdoor kitchen is equipped with stainless steel utensils, a two burner gas stove, solar lighting and solar fridge freezer. There is a braai on the deck with fold up chairs, picnic table bench combos and umbrellas. A log splitter and axe are provided for chopping wood (fire logs available).

# **RIVER SAFETY**

- It is compulsory that each client wear a lifejacket and helmet (supplied at the reserve).
- Each visitor must sign an indemnity form before embarking on the journey.
- CapeNature reserves the right to cancel the booking at any time should indemnity form not be signed or conditions prove to be dangerous.
- The route is not suitable for children between 0-8 years and school-going children must be accompanied by adults.
- If you paddle into high tide you can have a gentle ride up to the mooring point, but should you embark on your trip during low tide, be prepared to exit your canoe and PULL IT ACROSS RAPIDS.
- When exiting a canoe, extreme care must be taken on slippery rocks – water shoes are compulsory.
- There is a flat 400 m walk to the cabin, after mooring your canoe. Please make sure that you leave your canoe way above the high watermark
- There is no cell phone reception in the gorge.
- Pack lightly whatever you take you must be able to fit into the 30-liter dry bag and double canoe. You need to carry the items from the mooring area 400m to the cabin
- Remember a hat, sunscreen and mosquito repellent.
